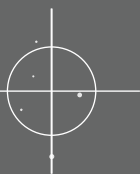




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WEEK ONE





THE GLORY OF GOD AND HIS CREATION

MAIN POINT:

Seeing the glory of God in creation changes us.

TEXT:

"The heavens declare the glory of God, and the expanse proclaims the work of his hands. Day after day they pour out speech; night after night they communicate knowledge. There is no speech; there are no words; their voice is not heard. Their message has gone out to the whole earth, and their words to the ends of the world. In the heavens he has pitched a tent for the sun. It is like a bridegroom coming from his home; it rejoices like an athlete running a course. It rises from one end of the heavens and circles to their other end; nothing is hidden from its heat."

PSALM 19: 1-6, CSB

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We are going to see a glimpse of something greater out there. Someone greater. And that glimpse, the Bible says, changes us.

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"The heavens declare the glory of God." One theologian describes it this way, "God's glory is on tour in the skies."

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The heavens are God's canvas. And he is the artist. The way you best understand the art is through the lens of the artist.

THE GRACE OF GOD IN HIS WORD

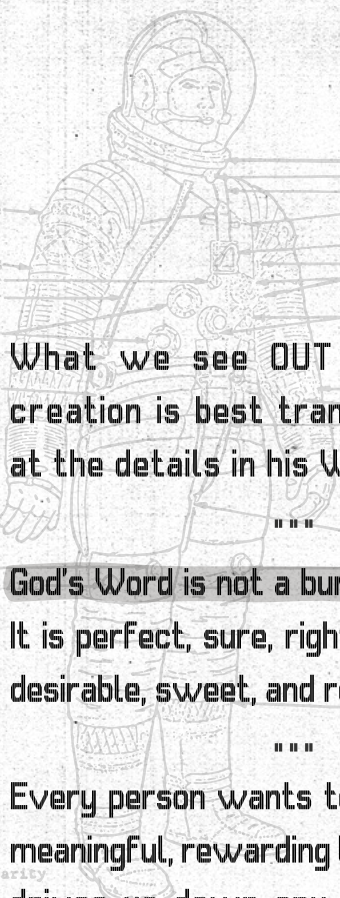
MAIN POINT:

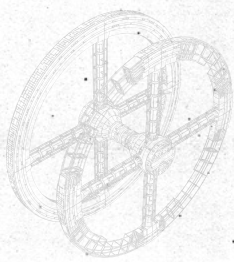
What we see OUT THERE in God's creation is best translated by looking at the details in his Word.

GROUP DISCUSSION:

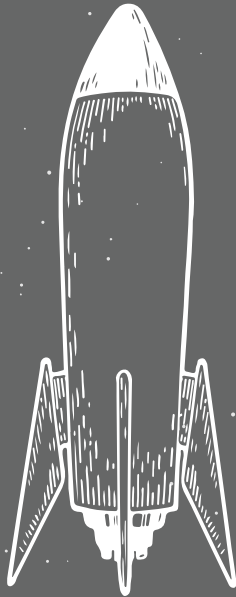
1. How do the commands of God give attention to every facet of our lives? (Think back to the words used to describe the effects of God's word on our lives.)

Keep going.



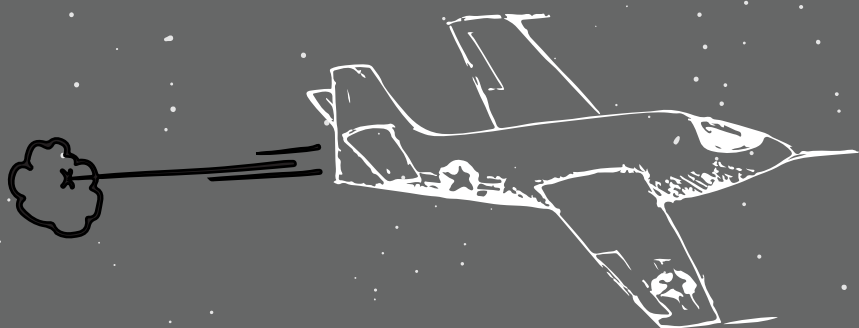
GROUP DISCUSSION:
